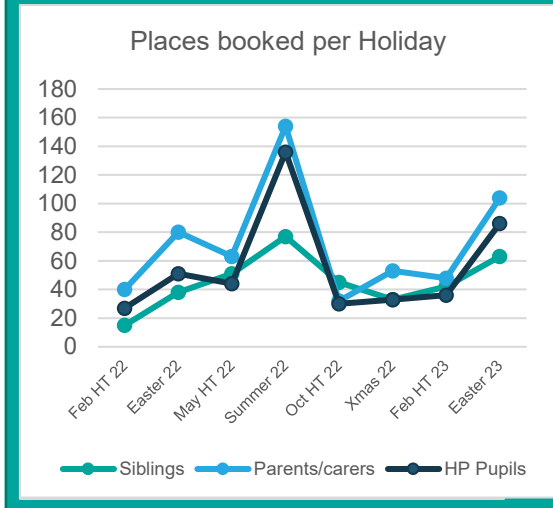

We cater a large range of activities in hope that there is something that will interest everyone. These activities are free of charge for parents due to Holiday Activity funding we receive and are aimed at all High Park School children but especially children who are on free school meals. We are discussing new activities such as a cycling club, an Alpaca experience, overnight Nell Bank sessions and theme parks. We try to meet the children's needs by booking fun, active and exciting activities which adapt their skills and allows access to all ages. Another possibility that we are considering is providing families with a voucher to redeem a free meal from the activity. We sent out a questionnaire and the feedback we received was amazing, some examples of parent's words are stated to the right.



We have expanded our variation of holiday activities since we first started in February 2022 and there has been a gradual increase in interest over the past year.

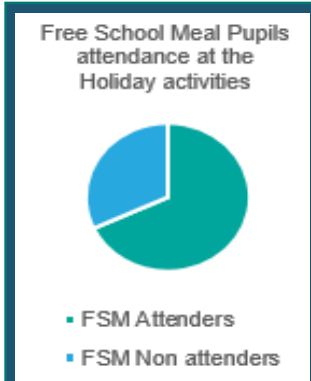
The Holiday Activity funding we have been allocated for this year has enlarged meaning we can provide more diverse opportunities.
